WHAT IS THE NC STUDENT ACADEMY OF SCIENCE?

The NC Student Academy of Science (NCSAS) is the pre-college student branch of the NC Academy of Science.

Among various activities, we:

- hold regional and state competitions in which 6th-12th grade students present their science projects in an oral presentation;
- organize meetings to provide guidance to students and teachers on science projects;
- introduce students and teachers to professional scientists and discuss current scientific research;
- administer a grant program for expenses related to scientific research projects.
